SCHOOL & COMMUNITY

Grandview Preparatory School is an independent, college preparatory, coeducational day school located less than a mile from the ocean in Boca Raton, Florida. Boca Raton sits on the east coast of Florida between West Palm Beach and Fort Lauderdale. Founded in 1997, Grandview is a vibrant community of learners enrolling students from early childhood (age3) through grade 12. The academic program operates on a semester system with a 4.0 grading scale. Students experience a challenging, research-based curriculum centering on both intellectual and personal development. All graduating seniors are preparing for enrollment in colleges or universities.

Grandview students have received national recognition for community service efforts. Our athletic program emphasizes an inclusive policy yet remains competitive in the community. Several varsity sports have received district, regional, and state recognition. Approximately 350 students are enrolled, with 50 seniors set to graduate in the spring of 2024.

GRANDVIEW @ EVERT

Grandview has partnered with Evert Tennis Academy to serve students at the Evert facility located in west Boca Raton. Students from around the world come to train at the Evert Tennis Academy and will board at the facility. Student athletes learning at Evert have the opportunity to build a customized academic schedule around the Academy's practices, tournaments, and private lessons. This is through a blended model of traditional classroom-based instruction for core classes and flexible online classes. This accommodating, well-rounded academic experience provides students with the time to develop their athletic talents to their highest potential.

DIPLOMA REQUIREMENTS

Grandview offers 3 diploma options:
Honors, Standard and CORE.

To earn the **Honors** diploma a student must graduate with a minimum of 5 Honors, Cum Laude Program (CL) or Dual Enrollment level courses.

Grandview offers an 18 credit **CORE** diploma primarily for student athletes who train extensively daily.

Class rank is not assigned. The top 2 academic achieving students are recognized as Summa Cum Laude and Magna Cum Laude at commencement.

GRADING

Grandview has two (2) semesters per year, and credits are granted at the end of each semester. The transcript provides a weighted cumulative core grade point average.

HONORS/ADVANCED COURSES

Honors courses have a weight factor of +0.5 applied. Courses marked IP or CL are honors courses where students have done additional work or an independent project to earn a full +1.0 point. The IP program transitioned to the CL program starting in the 2023-2024 academic year.

DUAL ENROLLMENT

Dual enrollment agreements are active with Florida Atlantic University and Palm Beach State College. Eligible students may take a maximum of 8 credits per semester and 4 credits over the Summer term.

COVID IMPACT

The physical campus of the school closed at the end of the third quarter in March of the 19-20 school year. The core curriculum was unchanged. Students were required to complete all course requirements virtually, and grades were awarded using our normal grading scale. Throughout the 2020-2021 and 2021-2022 school years, courses were offered to students to attend physically, virtually, or asynchronously according to each family's personal decision. The curriculum was not modified, and grades were awarded per our regular grading scale. Electives and extracurricular offerings were limited. For the 2023-2024 academic year, we are continuing to offer our core curriculum and have returned to our more robust elective and lab structures.
